Sample Size: 800 Massachusetts Democratic Primary Likely Voters

Margin of Error: +/-3.9% (adjusted for design effects)

Survey Mode: Online, web-based survey, self-administered

Sampling Method: YouGov interviewed 854 eligible respondents, who were then

matched down to a sample of 800 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education based on known characteristics of Democratic Party primary voters from the 2018 Cooperative

Congressional Election Study.

Weighting: The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using

propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were

combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on gender, race, age, and

education to produce the final weight.



Likely Voter Criterion: Voters are included in the frame after passing a behavioral screen

based on vote intention before the data are preprocessed and

post-stratified.
