# **Methodology in Brief**

Data was collected via an online sample by Qualtrics. Quota targets were set to balance the sample by 2year increments of age, race/ethnicity and gender for those born in 1981 or later. Data were then weighted by age, gender X race, highest level of education and region to ensure a representative sample. Targets were based on demographic data available from Current Population Survey 2016 Annual Social and Economic Supplement, <u>http://www.census.gov/cps/data/cpstablecreator.html</u>. Full details of the weighting procedure used and calculation and description of credibility intervals is available in our methodology report. All surveys are subject to various kinds of error, including bias from sampling, coverage bias, and non-response bias.

UMass Lowell is a public institution and releases surveys as a source of public information. We report our questionnaire in our topline document which includes likely voter model questions and wording. We offer a complete methodology report, as well an extensive set of crosstabs.
